RADIO ATLANTIS PHOTOSHOW

NEW

Radio Atlantis started out by hiring airtime from Radio Caroline before purchasing their own ship. As well as a popular Flemish service, Atlantis had an English service, programmed by Steve England, which had some inspired and fun programming bringing back some of the spirit of the 60's offshore stations. This photoshow disc features photographs from Steve England's collection, and a commentary by Steve. £19.99/28€ (Subscribers £15.00-20€)

THE OFFSHORE RADIO YEARS VOLUME 19

NEW

The story of the Dutch stations operating from the Ross Revenge. The popular Radio Monique, Radio 819 and Radio 558. Their popularity wasn't shared by the Dutch authorities, who were soon planning to get them off the air, culminating in a raid in August 1989.

THE OFFSHORE RADIO YEARS – RADIO CAROLINE THE EIGHTIES

This 4 DVD box set covers Radio Caroline's third offshore era, through her ship Mi Amigo sinking in March 1980, to the arrival of the Ross Revenge in 1983. The story continues with the arrival of Laser 558, the UK government surveillance operation, the loss of the 300 foot antenna mast during storms and the armed raid by the authorities in 1989. Concluding with the final offshore broadcast, the attempt to find a 3rd world licence and the radioship drifting onto the Goodwin sands. Radio Caroline's free radio years ended with the Ross Revenge taken into Dover, and under the control of the British authorities. £59.99 / 74.99€. Subscribers: £49.99-60€

THE OFFSHORE RADIO YEARS VOLUME 18

The success of Laser 558 caught the imagination of a radio enthusiast, who purchased the radioship after it had been seized by the British authorities. Despite sale clauses that forbid the ship being used for broadcasting again, it was soon back at sea, with alleged new ownership. Great enthusiasm and excellent production, were spoiled by a series of mast collapses that led to the station being off air for lengthy periods, and a consequent lack of revenue, which meant Laser Hot Hits wasn't the success of it's former namesake.

THE OFFSHORE RADIO YEARS VOLUME 17

Starting as Laser 730 with an unsuccessful balloon antenna, the station quickly became Laser 558, and an almost overnight success as "All Europe radio" hit the airwaves. The UK

commercial radio stations were outraged, as was the government who eventually forced Laser 558 off the air – but not before Laser had forced change in UK radio.

Things were just looking brighter for Caroline, when along came the unexpected – a raid by the Dutch and British authorities. The raid and its after effects, the provocative move of Spectrum radio to 558, the final offshore broadcast and the search for a 3rd world licence. This final part concludes Carolines free radio years, with the Ross Revenge taken into Dover, and under the control of the British authorities.

THE OFFSHORE RADIO YEARS VOLUME 15

Caroline survived a hurricane in late 1987, but her 300 foot antenna had been weakened and came crashing down a few months later. Caroline was soon back on air with a temporary aerial. New masts were delivered and a long period of re-building began. Easter 1989 saw Radio Caroline celebrate her 25th birthday. The British and Dutch authorities didn't join the celebrations, as they were planning much darker deeds. The third part of a set looking at Caroline in the '80's.

THE OFFSHORE RADIO YEARS VOLUME 14

Caroline and Laser 558, led to an offshore radio revival, that quickly captured a huge audience. The UK government launched a surveillance operation and blockade of the radio ships, and then extended UK territorial waters. This meant that Caroline's ship had to move to a more exposed position further out to sea, which was soon to have devastating consequences. This DVD is the second part of a set looking at Caroline in the 1980's.

THE OFFSHORE RADIO YEARS VOLUME 13

When Caroline's ship Mi Amigo sank in March 1980, many people thought it was the end of the station. But before long a new ship was being

fitted out in Spain, and started broadcasting in August 1983. Caroline celebrated her 20th birthday at Easter 1984, and shortly after was joined by a new neighbour – Laser 558. This DVD is the first part of a set looking at Caroline in the 1980's.

THE OFFSHORE RADIO YEARS VOLUME 12

Looking at some of the short lived offshore stations, as well as some that never made it. The Dutch Radio Paradijs from the Magda Maria, the much publicised radio ship for China Goddess of Democracy, from the Mediterranean Odelia TV and the EU funded Radio Brod, that broadcast during the Yugoslavia conflict.

THE OFFSHORE RADIO YEARS VOLUME 11

Abie Nathan, had the idea of setting up a radio station to try and bring peace between Jews and Arabs. The Voice of Peace broadcast from "somewhere in the Mediterranean" for just over twenty years, until an historic peace accord was signed between Palestine and Israel. Abie Nathan felt that he had at last achieved his aims, and closed down the radio station.

THE OFFSHORE RADIO YEARS VOLUME 10

Belgian businessman Sylvain Tack saw that having his own radio station, would be an ideal way of promoting his waffle bakery, music and publishing interests. He set up Radio Mi Amigo, which quickly became hugely successful. Radio Delmare, unlike Mi Amigo, didn't have the backing of a millionaire, it did however have its share of technical problems and lost its first ship during storms.

THE OFFSHORE RADIO YEARS VOLUME 9

The Dutch MOA in 1974, prompted Caroline to move back to the English coast. This didn't please the British government, and soon led to a darker period for Caroline. The station defiantly fought the law through the 1970's, but in the end it was Mother Nature that finished the Mi Amigo, when the ship sank in storms in March 1980.

THE OFFSHORE RADIO YEARS VOLUME 8

Few people expected Radio Caroline to return in 1972. The Mi Amigo was a rusting wreck in a Dutch dock, but was soon back broadcasting off the Dutch coast, with Radio Seagull, Loving Awareness, and much else followed before the Dutch MOA forced the Mi Amigo to return to off the English coast.

THE OFFSHORE RADIO YEARS VOLUME 7

When the Reverend Carl McIntire's radio stations were closed down, he took to the sea with Radio Free America. Capital Radio saw itself above other offshore stations, promoting itself with the slogan that broadcasting is a profession for Gentlemen. Radio Atlantis's deejays and jingles returned the fun and spirit to offshore radio.

THE OFFSHORE RADIO YEARS VOLUME 6

Radio Northsea International's story was as colourful as their multi-coloured radio ship. The more dramatic events were a fire bomb attack, an attempted hijacking and being jammed by the British government.

THE OFFSHORE RADIO YEARS VOLUME 5

Radio 270 broadcast successfully to Yorkshire. Radio England & Britain, on the Laissez Faire, were replaced by Radio 355 & Dutch language Radio's Dolfijn & 227. In New Zealand, Radio Hauraki broke the state radio monopoly and achieved what few other offshore stations did - a licence to broadcast from land.

THE OFFSHORE RADIO YEARS VOLUME 4

The abandoned wartime forts off the British coast were quickly seized by the offshore broadcasters, such as Radio Invicta - later named KING then 390. Radio Essex and Tower Radio both aimed at a local market. Meanwhile in the North, Radio Scotland, used a former lightship for their base.

THE OFFSHORE RADIO YEARS VOLUME 3

Radio Sutch was seen as a publicity stunt when it opened a few months after Caroline had turned UK radio on its head. Sutch soon upped it's power and changed its name to Radio City. However later in the year, an even more powerful challenge arrived from the USA - Big L -Radio London.

THE OFFSHORE RADIO YEARS VOLUME 2

The story of early offshore radio continues, with the story of the Flemish Radio Uilenspiegel and Radio and TV Noordzee from the specially built REM island off the Dutch coast. Also includes the story of Radio Caroline in the 60's.

THE OFFSHORE RADIO YEARS VOLUME 1

European radio was strictly state controlled until a group of Danish businessmen set up Radio Mercur on a ship in international waters, and outside government control. The station was followed by Radio Syd and Radio Nord, as well as Radio Veronica off the Dutch coast.

RADIO CAROLINE 30TH ANNIVERSARY

At Easter 1994, Caroline's former riodishop Ross Revenge was being used to present a special broadcast from Essex based Breeze AM. A commemorative event was also being held over the weekend, with many Caroline presenters, and headed by the Fortunes, well known for their song Caroline.

CAROLINE IN CALAIS

Shortly after Caroline's ship Ross Revenge ran aground and was salvaged from the Goodwin Sands, Offshore Echo's / France Radio Club arranged airtime on Calais based Radio 6. When this DVD was filmed in July 1991, Chris Frisco, Neil Gates and Jerry Wright were presenting the special Caroline programme.

EURORADIO 1990 & 1991

Offshore Echo's annual event was held at the 555 Club in Calais, in 1990 with Dave Asher, Caroline Martin, Tom Anderson, Nigel Harris & Mike Dundee. The club hosted a special Caroline

party that night presented by Tom Anderson. Euroradio 1991 included Andy Bradgate, Tony Kirk, Jerry Wright & Chris Frisco from Radio Caroline.

EURORADIO 2006

The annual Offshore Echo's / France Radio club event held in Calais, featured special guests Peter Philips & Kevin Turner from 80's Caroline and Dave Rogers from RNI & Radio Atlantis.

EURORADIO 2007

Guests included Caroline 60's engineer Carl Thomson, Dave McKay remembering life aboard the Laissez Faire, Woolf Byrne who worked on Britain Radio & Radio 390, plus surprise visitor. Luc Dunne, the chef on board Radio City recalling his days on the Tower of Power. A two hour bi-lingual presentation. £21.99/30€ (Subscribers: £19.99)

FREE RADIO - The Story of Clandestine Radio in the UK

Land based "pirate" radio broadcasts were from flats, houses as well as fields and woods and constantly ran the risk of being raided. Some stations like Jackie, Kaleidoscope & Skyline went on to become highly professional, whilst others created new innovations like the Gold format.

THE RADIO MI AMIGO REUNION

2004 saw the 30th anniversary of the start of Radio Mi Amigo. DJ's Norbert, Will van der Steen, Peter Van Dam & Bert Bennett were invited to a reunion and for a chance to recall the Mi Amigo days. The memories - and the beers - flowed, and were captured on this 102 minute long DVD.

THE VOP REUNION 2006

The 2006 Radioday in Amsterdam, saw a number of former Voice of Peace deejays reunited for the first time for many years. This DVD includes high quality professional video footage taken by Arbel Eshet, from Israeli TV, as well as featuring footage, jingles, tunes and off-air recordings of the VOP.

A UK government blockade led to Laser 558's demise, but it wasn't long before the station was back in a new guise as Laser Hot Hits. New Zealand's Radio Hauraki came on the air in November 1966. Owner David Gapes had continually applied for a broadcasting licence, and when this was eventually granted, the offshore Radio Hauraki closed on 1st June 1970.

LASER 558
Laser 558's unplanned demise on 6th November 1985 took most people by surprise and few recorded it. Thanks to Offshore Echos you can now hear that historic recording.

RADIO LONDON
Probably the most successful of the 60's offshore radio stations, London used an anglicised version of American Top 40 radio. The final hour with it's drop-ins from stars of the day, was aired on 14th August 1967.

A truly Scottish radio station was Scots businessman Tommy Shields dream, however the British Marine Offences Act, saw Radio Scotland close on 14th August 1967.

RADIO VERONICA
When the focus of offshore radio moved to the Dutch coast, the veteran Radio Veronica was joined by a number of other ships, which forced the government to pass their own Marine Offences Act. This station closed on 31st August 1974.
